<b>2A. (For Research Posters only)</b> <b>Presentation of findings of a study</b>		
Abstract: The abstract should include a summary of the objectives of the study, findings, and conclusions.	/10	
Purpose: Provide a brief background as to why the study was undertaken. State the study objectives or research hypothesis.	/10	
Methods: Clearly and concisely describe how the study was conducted. Include (as applicable) research setting, study design, selection criteria, measures, and data analysis.	/10	
Results: In reporting results, include standard deviations when reporting means, standard errors when displaying mean values graphically, levels of significance, and other relevant statistical information. All tables and graphs should be labeled sufficiently to stand alone -- clearly worded titles, figure legends, etc.	/10
