Ben Hartmann is the Manager, Perron Rotary Express Milk Bank, King Edward Memorial Hospital for Women, Perth. In 2005 he was employed to prepare a business plan for the Perron Rotary Express Milk Bank (PREM Bank) and was subsequently employed as Telethon Postdoctoral Research Fellow to **implement the business plan and establish Australia's first** contemporary human milk bank.

Gillian Opie is a Full time Neonatal Paediatrician at the Mercy Hospital for Women, Heidelberg. Also an International Board Certified Lactation Consultant, accredited BFHI assessor and educator, treasurer of BFHI Victoria and Director of LKANZ.

Katherine Carroll is a medical sociologist and health services researcher from the Department of Sociology and Social Policy at the University of Sydney. Her past research has examined the role of lactation consultants in the Australian health care system and their beliefs about infant feeding.

Kevin Nicholas works at the Institute of Technology Research and Innovation, Deakin University, Geelong. His research programs have been directed at lactation in a variety of animals. He moved to his current position in 2008 to continue working on the comparative genomics of animals with extreme adaptation to lactation with a focus on providing new opportunities to identify genes regulating milk composition and bioactives in milk.
